


2018-2019 Funding for our 30 Beds

In 2018-2019, it cost \$1,216,627 to provide 30 beds and services to women and their dependents who resided with us. The Ministry of Children, Community & Social Services (MCCSS) provided \$1,042,069 in operating funds for 20 of those beds. Your donations and one-time grants provided the \$174,558 in operating expenses required to fund the additional 10 beds.

It's been another busy year at Interval House of Ottawa, starting with some staffing changes! Our former Executive Director, Kia Rainbow, took a new position at Cornerstone Housing for Women. On behalf of everyone at IHO, we thank Kia for everything she has done for IHO, and wish her the very best in her future.

We were fortunate enough to expand our team by two positions this past year to include a Pet Housing & Maintenance Support Worker and a Community Engagement Worker. Our Pet Housing & Maintenance Support Worker ensures the pet housing area is maintained and provides exercise and companionship to the animals who stay with us. Thanks to our new Community Engagement Worker, we now have a dedicated person to look after our fundraising, communications and public education efforts. This past year also brought about the completion of our pet housing yard project. Construction was wrapped up on both the exterior door to the yard and the yard landscaping. We'd like to extend a big thank you to Ottawa Young Construction Leaders for creating such a beautiful space! As part of our strategic plan, the staff and board sat down and created a set of values for IHO. They are: client-centred, empathy, empowerment, equality, accountability, and respect. We feel these six words encompass the beliefs of IHO, and we even placed them by our front entrance so we can be reminded of them every day.

We are overwhelmed by the dedication shown by our staff and board of directors and by the generosity of our donors.
